Maybe this is finally the year when we can get back to normal and have some UFO meetings. However, I am no longer in a position where I can be depended on to attend. But I can be a great deal of help in setting up meetings. I can get the mailings out, provide name tags, help provide announcements on our website, help provide meeting writeups, and help get reimbursements for expenses, etc.

I look to our Area Representatives to arrange meetings, but you do not need to be an Area Representative to arrange a meeting. There is no single format for a meeting. What has seemed to work best in the past is midweek luncheon meetings at or near the airport. We have also had museum visits, tours of aviation facilities, speakers, etc. Anyone setting up a meeting that is attended by 10 or more members will receive an almost automatic \$50 to reimburse expenses. With proper preplanning I can help obtain up to \$250 for expenses such as room rental, museum fees, bus transportation, lunch for a speaker, etc. If you have a good idea for a meeting and are willing to help implement it, please let me know.

I have just completed preparation of the 2022 Friendship Directory and it should be in the mail this weekend. It contains more than just member contact information. It shows that the UFO membership has continued to grow (slightly) even with all the Covid issues. We currently have almost 1700 members, including 167 in the Mid-Atlantic Region. A total of 37 are new UFO Mid Atlantic members who joined in 2021 and 2022.

We had a difficult year administratively in 2021 because of the loss of our Treasurer and also our website manager. For most part we have recovered. We have gained a newsletter editor, Ken Brown, and our newsletter is now distributed to all our members for whom we have an e-mail address.

Please remember that the UFO is run by 80+ year old volunteers. The sole exception is the paid administrative assistant who handles our records and financial tracking. Our 90-year-old President, Jim Cavender, is an outstanding example of the volunteer effort that keeps this organization running. Among other things he is also the acting Treasurer. For starters, that involves processing 1700 payments per year.

Thanks to you who responded to the member survey sent by our Newsletter Editor. We had excellent response with almost half of our members responding. We will review the information to see what new ideas and programs we can implement. John Sullivan

So what did I do on my birthday? Went to the US Army Aeromedical Research Laboratory where I work part time as a consultant on anything that can affect or enhance aviators' vision such as night vision goggles and optical assessments of protective eyewear such as laser protective visors. <https://federallabs.org/labs/us-army-aeromedical-research-laboratory-usaarl#about> . After lunch went to the airport to practice the proposed IAC Intermediate Known and my Free Style sequences. The weather was perfect with clear skies, temps above 50 degrees, and calm winds. With the 10 maneuvers in the sequence, I pulled 5.2 positive and 2.2 negative Gs while staying in the 1000 x 1000 meter box most of the time. With my Free Style sequence, it was 5.0 positive and 3.2 negative Gs, which included an inverted spin and inverted push out from a down 45 degree line. YeeeeHaaaa. I'm still planning on my bucket list item of flying in an aerobatic contest at the Intermediate level in my RV-4 and over 80 years old. 





## A story of courage and perseverance

### THE MOST MEMORABLE FLIGHT OF MY LIFE

The year was 2017

It was clear and cool that November day. It was the kind of weather that beckons both plane and pilot to explore the endless sky. The winds were light and the distance short but when the pilot rose to speak at the UFO luncheon he said "The flight here was one of the most memorable flights of my life". How could that be? It was a simple uneventful 32 mile solo between Danbury and New Haven, Connecticut. The answer lies in some things the 80 year old pilot did not say that day but I have his permission to tell you now.

Young John Barrett was one of those crazy kids that lived and breathed airplanes. I suppose that could describe any one of us. At 14 he knew exactly what he was going to do with his life. He was going to be a jet fighter pilot in the United States Air Force.

But at 15 John was stricken with kidney tuberculosis. The doctors did all they could, but it was 1947 and no effective treatment was known at the time. After a three year struggle his left kidney was removed. He was just 18. So much for the Air Force, but John did not give up; there were always civilian planes he could command. He took private lessons and began to fly.

When 1991 rolled around, John underwent surgery to repair a 90% occluded carotid artery. Ten years later the same operation was performed again, this time on the other side of his neck. But there is more -- in 2010 John underwent chemotherapy treatment for colorectal cancer, completely unrelated to his earlier afflictions. He conquered that one too. Another year went by and the doctors told John he had lung cancer. The year was 2011. This was a third type of tumor, not one that had metastasized from his colon cancer. Half of his left lung was cut out. That brings us to November, 2012.



On November 13, 2012 John Barrett celebrated his 80th birthday at home with his wife Lorna. The very next day and now 80 years of age, he flew alone in a Piper Dakota to the UFO luncheon. A pilot's pilot, John had beaten all the odds and qualified to become one of the special band-of-brothers who call themselves The United Flying Octogenarians. Now you know why his head dipped and why his voice faltered when he rose and slowly..., slowly told the group "Yesterday I turned 80, and today I flew. It was one of the most memorable flights of my life".

Could it be that the life of this man of courage was extended by his passion for flight? If so, we would like to think the club played a small part by defining a specific goal to seek. But it was John's own courage, determination and passion for flight that made it happen. And who does John credit? George Terranova, MD, the AME who guided him through the FAA Medical Special Issuance process under which he has been flying uninterrupted ever since 1991.
